02-2023-Motion to adopt Cruse and Dan Bloem,2nd, motion to approve amendment was carried.

03-2023- SOP's go to JA. No revalidation will be accepted without your SOP. Motion by JR May and 2nd by Snake to adopt was carried.

04-2023-Department who send SOP's must go through to the National JA. Motion by Snake-Kentucky, 2nd by JR May to adopt. Motion carried.

05-2023 -At mid-year rally the body agreed to rotate the mid-year event with a change in verbiage for time frames. Form to be filed prior to mid-year for the following year.

Motion Hambone, Florida, Erskine from New York, and the Motion carried

06-2023 Sets up the authority to set up an AMVETS Riders honor guard and uniform criteria.

Motion JR May, Kentucky and Kevin Ashe from Georgia. Clarification is that it is a separate uniform only to be worn for an honor guard. Motion was passed after discussion.

13.13-Only the following patches. Eliiminate 10" Patch and use 8" or 12" only.
